- Students who receive a total of three (3) D and/or F grades in Criminology major coursework at USF will no longer be eligible to continue in the Criminology major. Grade forgiveness will not exclude a D or F grade from counting for this rule.
- [~] Major Residency Requirement: A minimum of 30 credit hours of major course work must be taken in residence at the University of South Florida. Therefore, no more than 6 credit hours of transfer work (two courses) will be accepted to meet major requirements.
- [~] Major Internship Opportunities: Students have the opportunity to earn up to 9 credits by doing an internship with a federal, state, or local criminal justice related agency. This affords students the opportunity to network and gain practical experience in conjunction with their degree.
- ["] Major Research Opportunities: Center For Justice Research and Policy (CJRP); Cybercrime Interdisciplinary Behavioral Research Lab (C.I.B.R. Lab); USF Trafficking in Persons. Risk to Resilience Lab (TIP Lab); Crime Research Etiology and Treatment Evaluate (CREATE) Lab; Sarasota Cybersecurity.
- ["] Foreign Language Requirement: Students need to show proficiency at the college level in a foreign language to graduate. This can be accomplished by taking two semesters of the same foreign language in college or by taking a test at HCC or USF if the student speaks a second language. Please consult an advisor to see which method will be best.
